Various renowned personalities from the field of physiotherapy across the nation graced the occasion. Esteemed speakers, who played a significant part in the creative process of development of whatever technology we know of today, came together under one roof to provide the students and professionals with an insight into the same.

Chief Guest for the Conference was Dr. A. K. Aggarwal, President Delhi Council of Physiotherapy and Occupational Therapy & Guest Of honor was Dr. Sanjiv Jha (PT) IAP President & Director at Centre for Chronic Disease and Research, Indore.

The event began with lamp lighting ceremony which was followed by a session on 'Physiotherapy and Telemedicine' by Dr. Seema Grover (PT), Chief Physiotherapist at Indraprastha Apollo Hospital. Dr Seema Grover briefed the attendees about application based communication and how it brings a difference both in the life of the patient and the therapist. This session was followed by a talk on 'Gamification' by Dr. Nishat Quddus (PT), Associate Professor, Jamia Hamdard. The talk encompassed the upcoming use of games in improving a patient'soverall health and well-being.

Dr. Monica Chabbra (PT), Senior Physiotherapist, PGIMER, Chandigarh, presented a clinicians view in bringing '3D Gait Analysis' from laboratory to clinics. Dr. Monica Chabbra (PT) with the aid of highly informative videos showed how 3D gait analysis can help in a better and effective gait evaluation.

The occasion was also graced by Mr. Aakash Sinha, Founder and CEO at Omnipresent Robot Tech, who shared a part of his immense knowledge in 'AI and Robotics'. Mr. Sinha showed how robotics can change and improve the present rehabilitation scenario and thus contribute in the betterment of the society.

'Recent advances in Sports Sciences Evaluation and Technology' was the topic taken up by none other than Dr. Meenu Dhingra (PT), Senior Scientific Officer, Sports Authority of India (SAI), who is also the Head of Human Performance Lab at Sports Authority of India. Dr. Meenu highlighted the newest upcoming in the field of sports physiotherapy while focusing mainly on evaluation tools. The talk was followed by a break for lunch and was later picked up by Dr. Megha Saini (PT) and Dr. Neha, Researchers at IIT Delhi, who explained how a 'Robotic Exoskeleton' can be used in post-stroke rehabilitation. Dr. Megha Saini is an Alumni of BCIP and both Dr. Megha and Dr. Neha self-designed the robotic exoskeleton in collaboration with IIT and AIIMS.

Next Dr. Tejaswitha Kanchan (PT), Neurophysiotherapist, Kokilaben Dhirubhai Ambani Hospital, Mumbai, explained the use of 'Robotics in Lower Limb Neurorehabilitation'. She, from her experience, confirmed that robotics is the upcoming future in neurorehabilition.

The session was culminated by a talk on 'Inspiratory Muscle Trainer: Advancement in Cardiopulmonary Physiotherapy'.

Scientific sessions were started parallel to the guest talks.

Sessions were divided in four parts- senior poster presentation, Junior poster presentation, Senior scientific research paper presentation, and Junior scientific research paper presentation.

Students and professionals were given a platform to present their work and earn not only recognition but also bag exciting prizes.

The winners of the scientific sessions were awarded.

The first prize for Senior scientific research paper presentation was bagged by, Ms. Sumbul Ansari, from Centre for Physiotherapy and Rehabilitation Science, Jamia Milia islamia, Jamia Nagar, Okhla, and the second prize was taken by Ms. Supriya Mehta, ISIC institute of Rehabilitation Sciences, Vasant kunj.
